Young leader brings passion, dedication to Leadership Sinai

Mount Sinai Hospital is close to people's hearts for different reasons. For Andrew Miller, Mount Sinai is where he and his young family - wife Eryn and two children, James and Nicole - were born.

Like so many who've been touched by their experience at Mount Sinai, Miller has found a way to give back to the Hospital that is both rewarding and stimulating. He began thinking about ways he could contribute when his wife Eryn, who worked at the Hospital Foundation in 2005, told Miller about the volunteers, roughly his age, who organized golf tournaments and other events to raise money for the Hospital.

"At the time I worked for a large consulting firm and I was looking for a way to give back to the community as well as network with my contemporaries," explains Miller. "Leadership Sinai offers me all of this."

A graduate of the Schulich School of Business with an International MBA in Logistics and Marketing, Miller is now the president of ACM Consulting, a company that helps clients run their businesses more efficiently and effectively. He is the treasurer of Leadership Sinai, a member of the Board of Directors, has co-chaired the Future Leaders Summit for the past two years, and secured sponsors and a speaker for Lunch with Leaders.

At the most recent Future Leaders Summit, Michael Bregman, President of Tailwind Capital, Immediate Past Chair of the Foundation Board and Vice Chair of the Hospital Board, challenged the Leadership Sinai team to come up with a new event for the Hospital. Miller was up to the challenge and took on the role of chair of the committee charged with developing and executing the event.

The project is being called the Million Dollar Event, and has the goal of raising that amount for the Foundation each year. Currently, the event is in the planning stage, but Miller says the aim is to create an experience that can be repeated regularly and will appeal not only to Leadership Sinai members but also to a wider audience.

Committees are now being formed to hammer out the details of the event, as well as an ongoing donor recognition program. Meanwhile, Miller is enjoying the benefits of belonging to the Leadership Sinai team, which he describes as "a group of intelligent peers with a common objective."

An all-around active member of the community, Miller sits on the Supply Chain and Logistics Advisory Committee for Humber College. He also volunteers with the Larry Grossman Foundation for Kids and sits on the Marketing Committee for Temple Sinai Congregation. He is an avid reader, traveler and sports participant.

"Leadership Sinai allows me to bring positive change to the Hospital and the incredible staff that supports it on a daily basis," Miller says. "Mount Sinai has a strong reputation for offering the best healthcare. I want to do anything I can to preserve that reputation."
